Uptown Sky to receive \$5.82 million from Hillsborough County Affordable Housing Services

On Wednesday, May 20, 2020 the Hillsborough County's Board of County Commissioners unanimously approved the packaging \$19.76 million of grants and County funds to provide affordable multi family homes. The largest awardee, receiving \$5,820,000, was <u>Uptown Sky</u>.

Corporation (UACDC) partnered to propose Uptown Sky, a 60-unit, four-story new construction property. The site is located on the major east-west thoroughfare of Fletcher Avenue and 12th Street, in the newly-rebranded Uptown neighborhood.


